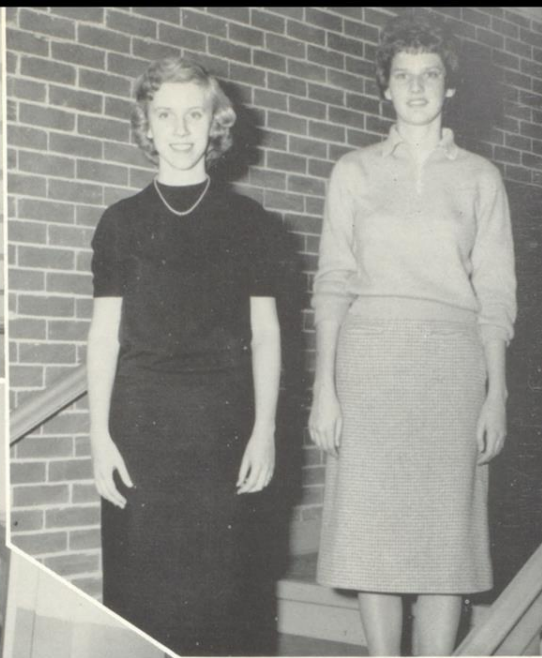

Our school requires two units in mathematics for graduation. The program is designed to meet the needs of students planning to enter college, business school or the business world. For those going to college we offer four full years of high school mathematics, for others there are general mathematics and business mathematics.

Hinton High School has a definite requirement for graduation in the Social Studies field. Each graduate must have at least three units of Social Studies one of which must be American History.

In the seventh grade Geography is the basic Social Study. In the eighth grade U. S. History is the basic subject and in order to meet the state law W.V.A. History, Geography, and Government is taught as a special project at least one six weeks or more.

Civics, World History, World Geography, W.V.A. History, American History, psychology, sociology, Drivers' Education, P.A.D, Economics, and Business Law permit the student to have a well rounded Social Studies program that is modern in every respect and also to meet the North Central requirements.

The aim of the department is to give pupils an understanding of the development of democracy and an appreciation of the system of government under which we live.

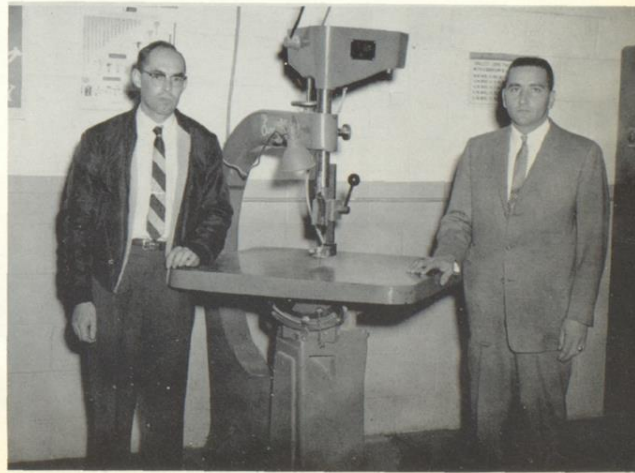
Industrial arts can be a distinctive part of every boy's education. It can contribute something that he can't learn in any other area.

SENIORS '61 IN CHARLES II'S COURT

As it was nearing 3:00 a. m., we bid the King and Queen adieu and climbed into our carriage for the journey home. Seeing the lamplighter, Jackson Goff, putting out the lights, we realized what a long day it had been and how tired we really were.

You see? History really does repeat itself!
