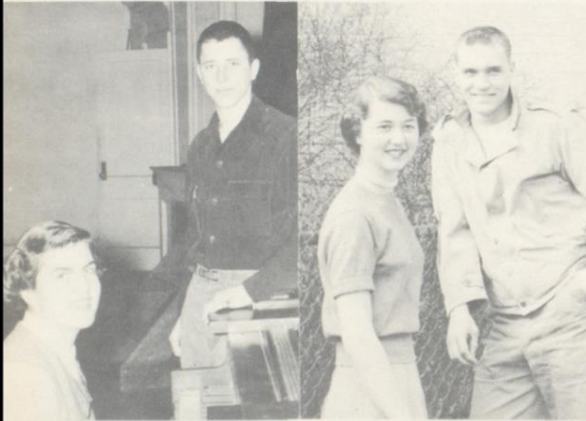

Class History

In September, 1946, an enthusiastic group of seventh graders entered the halls of H. H. S. for the first time. We elected William Beasley as our class president, and even managed a play, "Herbie's First Date", with Tommy Hanifin as Herbie and Ella Sue Morris as his date. Other members of the cast were Joan Cobb, Nancy Hellems, Dana Hamrick, Tom Payne, and Glen McCormick. A wiener roast followed for members of the cast.

The following year we re-entered H. H. S., a little less boisterously, perhaps. This year we chose Jack Lilly president and Margaret Wykle, secretary and treasurer. This was a quiet year.

In September, 1948, we were at last full fledged high schoolers. Ronnie Keaton was chosen president, Jack Lilly, vice-president, and Lee Patton, secretary and treasurer.

During our sophomore year, we entered school once more. This time we held our heads up high with complete assurance, and most of our greenness had vanished into thin air. We elected Tom Allen to lead us as president. Serving with him were Jane Ferguson, vice-president, Ronnie Keaton, secretary, and Mary Kellan Yancey, treasurer. This year we presented "Dancing Moonbean Minstrel", with Tom Hanifin, Denny Garten, Tom Payne, Bill Phillips, Jimmy Harvey, and Dick Hackney as end men. This play met with much approval.

At last we were upperclassmen whom we had envied since our early days, and found ourselves more pleased than we had ever been in our life. We chose "We Pull The Most When We Pull Together" as our motto. We also chose the red rose as our flower and red and white as our colors. We proved we could live up to our motto by putting on a variety show, "Remember When", which was well received. A party for the cast followed at the American Legion Club. In an election held in the fall, Bill Nichols was chosen as president, Tom Allen, vice-president, Jimmy Harvey, secretary, and Katie Caldwell, treasurer. In May we honored the seniors with the annual junior-senior banquet and prom. The rainbow theme was chosen for both affairs. Jan Campbell and his orchestra played for the dance. Later the same month there was a wiener roast for the class.

This being our senior year, we found ourselves sporting some of that "senior dignity" through the halls. We elected Lee Patton to lead us as president, Jack Lilly, vice-president, Katie Caldwell, secretary, and Mary Shires, treasurer. On November 16 we had our Senior Carnival, which was both money making and a lot of fun. We also won first prize for our float at the Homecoming Parade. We looked forward to our play which was given in March. Some of the activities which we eagerly anticipated were Junior-Senior Banquet and Prom, Sneak Day, Senior Week, Commencement Sermon, Citizenship Pageant, and of course GRADUATION and Senior Farewell.
