Class History

The following year we re-entered H. H. S., a little less boisterously, perhaps. This year we chose Jack Lilly president and Margaret Wykle, secretary and treasurer. This was a quiet year.

At last we were upperclassmen whom we had envied since our early days, and found ourselves more poised than we had ever been in our life. We chose "We Pull The Most When We Pull Together" as our motto. We also chose the red rose as our flower and red and white as our colors. We proved we could live up to our motto by putting on a variety show, "Remember When", which was well received. A party for the cast followed at the American Legion Club. In an election held in the fall, Bill Nichols was chosen as president, Tom Allen, vice-president, Jimmy Harvey, secretary, and Katie Caldwell, treasurer. In May we honored the seniors with the annual junior-senior banquet and prom. The rainbow theme was chosen for both affairs. Jan Campbell and his orchestra played for the dance. Later the same month there was a wiener roast for the class.

This being our senior year, we found ourselves sporting some of that "senior dignity" through the halls. We elected Lee Patton to lead us as president, Jack Lilly, vice-president, Katie Caldwell, secretary, and Mary Shires, treasurer. On November 16 we had our Senior Camival, which was both money making and a lot of fun. We also won first prize for our float at the Homecoming Parade. We looked forward to our play which was given in March. The Hinton Bobcat gridders of '51 early became known as a "one-half" team. In their first few games--Mullens, East Bank, and Princeton--they made a good showing in onehalf only to come back and be completely stopped dead.

Season of '51

In the first game at Mullens, the Bobcats battled furiously in the first half and led 7-0 going into the last half. Then they "bogged down" in the mud and couldn't score again. R. Patrick scored the touchdown, while Clinebell played one of his better games.

The next Friday they journeyed to East Bank to meet a heavily favored Pioneer Team. With the absence of Brown, Allen took over quarterback and led them to a 7-0 lead at the end of the first half, with "Lil Dickie" Wiseman carrying it across on a beautiful "Statue-of-Liberty" play. It was entirely different in the second half, as a much heavier Pioneer team wore the Bobcats down and won going away, 26-7.

In the first home game of the season with Princeton, Hinton hopped off to two quick touchdowns and led 12-0. However, before the half, Princeton had gone ahead 13-12. They scored again in the second half and won 20-12. Brown and Ratliff scored for Hinton.

Hinton hoped to get back in the win column again the following week against Stoco but were overpowered by the tune of 20-13, with Ratliff scoring all the points for Hinton.

Again journeying away from home and playing the Richwood Lumberjacks, the "up-and-down" Bobcat team was completely outplayed and lost by 39-6. Hinton's only score came on a beautiful pass-play from Brown to Ratliff.

The next week, a completely changed Bobcat team played host to Oak Hill, who was highly favored and was expected to win by a larger margin than they did, 24-12. Ratliff again scored Hinton's points with his Co-Captain, J. Patrick, absent from the line-up.

Then came Webster Springs, a team about which not much was known except they were big. The Bobcats battled "tooth-and-nail" in this one and finally won out 6-0 with Allen taking it across for his first touchdown of the season.

Next should have been the traditional Thanksgiving Day game with Beckley, but this year the "Turkey" tilt was moved up for various reasons. Already Beckley was making plans for the State Championship game without even regarding "little-ole-Hinton." Our boys didn't like this much and seemed determined to make a game of it. This seemed impossible, as the Beckley team was really of championship caliber and couldn't be stopped, rolling up a 47-6 score over hapless Hinton, with Allen scoring the sole touchdown for Hinton.

This ended a dark and gloomy season, which saw only two wins posted along with seven defeats; however, the Bobcats were in there scrapping in every game.


