Raymond Robert Haythe, 69, of 419 Temple St. died Friday at 2:20 a.m. in a Hinton hospital after a long illness.

Born in Hinton, June 16, 1910, he was a son of the late Joseph and Flora Stewart Haythe.

A lifelong resident of Hinton, Mr. Haythe was a retired conductor for the Chessie System, having retired in 1975 with 40 years of service. He served one term in the House of Delegates in Summers County, was a member of the Central Baptist Church in Hinton, where he served as deacon, and the Masonic Lodge 62.

He was a World War II veteran and a member of the Hinton Moose Lodge and a past governor.

Survivors include his wife, Bernice Grimmitt Haythe, a son, Robert S. Haythe of Hinton and one grandchild.

Services were held Sunday at 2:30 p.m. in the Ronald Meadows Funeral Parlors in Hinton with the Revs. Ronald Williams and C.H. Martin officiating. Burial followed in the Greenbrier Burial Park in Hinton.
